	Nylon string and lengths of line or string
	Needles and twine
	Duct tape
	Ziploc plastic bags
	Rubbish bags
	Bottled water (e.g. 4x0.5L) – leave some air in the containers to ensure that they can float
	Signaling mirror, whistle and fog horn
	Handheld marine compass
	Thermal/Survival blankets
	Distress V sheet
	Bailer & Sponge (hint: you can make a bailer from a bottle)
	Liferaft repair kit
	Survival manual / table of life-saving signals
	Survival navigation kit: quartz watch, school protractor & plastic ruler for improvising a quadrant, equation of time graph and noon sun table, photocopy of chart or a sketch for the area
	Waterproof notebook & pencil
	Waterproof matches & lighter
	Liferaft fishing survival kit (fishing line, hooks, lures)
	Baby wipes & toilet paper in a waterproof bag
	Supply of emergency food (tinned food and high-energy food)

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Graduated drinking vessels
Chemical heat packs
Sunscreen, lip balm, sunhat, sunglasses
Cutting board
Pack of cards to keep up morale
Swimming goggles to be able to see in bad storms
Waterproof mobile phone
Ship's papers and passports (or laminated copies)
Credit card and some money
Extra batteries / Powerbank for charging communication equipment
Numbers / Channels to dial to call for help

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Second Grab-Bag (collected from around the boat in an emergency)
□ EPIRB & PLB
☐ Watertight handheld VHF and GPS with spare batteries
☐ Satellite phone with waterproof cover and spare batteries
☐ SART (search and rescue transponder beacon)
☐ First aid kit stored on board (medical supplies), prescription medications
☐ Additional water and food
☐ Additional flares stored on board
☐ Drysuits, warm clothes (ideally wind and rainproof) and blankets
□ Binoculars
☐ Large plastic container / Basket
☐ Charts and navigation tools
☐ Sextant and Publications (almanac, sight reduction tables, and proformas as a minimum)
☐ Ship's documentation and logbook
$\square$ Cockpit cushions (anything that can isolate you from the cold bottom of the liferaft)
□ Solar charging kit
☐ Desalination kit (handheld watermaker)
☐ Sea anchor with a swivel and more than 30m of line
Crew personal Grab-Bag
☐ Wallet with passport, visas, bank cards, money, ID, driving license and medical insurance
☐ Mobile phone and charger
☐ House and car keys
☐ Personal medications

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
